POLICY TOPIC: Conflicts of Interest

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I. Introduction

San Juan College Board members endeavor to perform their duties faithfully and objectively in the best interest of the public they serve. In this effort, the Board holds that it is vital to never give rise, real or apparent, to a conflict of interest in any College related matter.

II. Board Member Conflicts of Interest

Therefore, no member of the Governing Board shall knowingly:

- A. Accept or let any immediate family member or close personal associate accept favors or gratuities of significant economic value from any firm, person, or corporation that is engaged in or attempting to engage in, business transactions with the College.
- B. Disclose or use confidential information about the College to advance the financial or other private interests of said member or other.
- C. Use College assets or equipment for any unauthorized, unlawful, or improper purpose or to promote a personal interest.
- D. Participate in the negotiation or the making of any contract between the College and any business entity in which the employee or their immediate family or close personal associate has a financial interest, either directly or indirectly.
- E. Represent a private interest in any action or proceeding before the Governing Board.
- F. Request or receive any money, thing of value, or promise thereof that is conditioned upon, or given in exchange for, performance or promised performance of an official act.
- G. Render any commercial service to the College on a commission basis.
- H. Serve on any other public governing board or represent any other public entity without fully disclosing that relationship to the Governing Board and advising the Governing Board when action as a board member, a representative of any other

public entity may impact or implicate their actions as a board member of San Juan College.

- I. Violate any provision of the Governmental Conduct Act 10-16-1 et seq NMSA (1978).
