#### 1. Questions on Board Agenda Items

## 2. Fiscal Year 2022 Year-End Budget Adjustment Request

Mr. Edward DesPlas briefed the Trustees on the year-end Budget Adjustment Request for the current fiscal year. The adjustment of the 3% pay increase that was effective April 1, 2022, was also discussed.

3. Pay Scale Adjustments: Professional Staff, Support Staff, and Adjunct Faculty
The Trustees were briefed on the recommendations to adjust the range minimums for
Professional Staff and Support Staff pay ranges in response to the required \$15/hour
minimum wage that is effective July 1. Also recommended is a 7% increase to adjunct
faculty pay, from \$705/credit hour to \$755/credit hour. And, of course, the 4% pay
increase for eligible full time and part time employees is still on schedule for July 1.

### 4. Fiscal Year 2023 Original Budget Request

Trustees were briefed and discussion occurred on the fiscal year 2023 budget request.

#### 5. Amended Facilities Master Plan

Since the last amendment to the College's Facilities Master Plan was approved a year ago, it was determined that additional projects needed to be added to the plan. Those additions were discussed with the Trustees.

### 6. Priorities for State Capital Funding Requests

Following the review of the proposed 2022 amendment to the Facilities Master Plan, we discussed the recommendations for our top three capital projects for the next cycle of state funding requests which include: 1) Replacement of roofs on Henderson Fine Arts Center; 2) Replacement of roofs on Education Services Building and CFDC; and 3) Replacement of fire alarms on Trades & Tech, CFDC, and HHPC.

# 7. Requests for Congressionally Directed Community Project Funding A review of the seven requests for Congressionally Directed Community Project spending was discussed.
